KNOW GOALS

"Know" goals are learned by memorization, or repetition, or books, etc.

For all Believers:

- Books of the Bible
- Basic Theology
- Worldviews and issues of life
- Basic Bible stories and Bible characters
- Overview of the Bible
- Teaching the students to love Jesus and worship HIM
- Memorize key verses and plans for sharing Christ with someone
- Memorize 150 key scripture verses

For those considering a Christian career, add the following:

- Biblical Beliefs I and II, and Cover to Cover
- Life Mapping your future
- Read five books annually on issues of your faith or church (attending seminars on church or theology would be considered one of the five)
- Be mentored in Bible doctrine
- Do an ongoing program of scripture memory or join a Bible quiz team or be mentored in Bible courses/study



BE GOALS

"BE" goals are learned primarily by being mentored by positive believers who pour into one's life. These relate to Character.

For all believers:

- Be mentored by someone who will give the student projects to work on in his/her life regularly.
- Develop the Fruit of the Spirit
- Develop spiritual gifts
- Be thankful and gracious
- Be bold and take initiative
- Be discerning of right and wrong
- Be separate from the world's standards
- Be obedient and respectful to authority
- Be warm and engaging with people
- Be able to start and keep conversations going and build relations with others
- Deal with sin quickly
- Deal with conflict
- Be able to confront lovingly and yet strongly
- Be faithful to the local church and youth group
- Love people

For those considering a Christian career, add the following:

- Be the best workers in the youth group
- Be there early to set up and stay late
- Be great with people
- Be willing to get your "hands" dirty in being involved in the lives of others
- Be the first to volunteer to pray, to share a testimony, to volunteer
- Be great with peers and adults
- Interact with adults openly and faithfully
- Have a great testimony at home and school

DO GOALS

"DO" goals are learned by experiences—often and varied

For all believers:

- Be on-mission in life—thinking of serving the Lord through your life
- Be in the Word by reading it daily
- Be in prayer every day
- Show mercy to those who are hurting
- Give of your money to the Lord's work and give of your time and talents
- Initiate serving others
- Be willing to do hard things and be a hard worker
- Be a good student who loves people and thinks of others
- Be baptized
- Be faithful in taking communion
- Disciple someone younger than you
- Look for ways to serve others by talking to them, sitting with them, extending a hand, going on ministry trips and serving others

For those considering a Christian career, add the following:

- Be willing to start or be involved in the leadership of a Bible Club or outreach Bible study
- Initiate ministry teams and volunteer as a VBS helper, Sunday school teacher, camp counselor or do an internship
- Tithe
- Take short-term trips
- Meet with people who are doing the type of ministry you would like to do
- Participate in Momentum
- Go to Urban Hope to do ministry
- Apply for Operation Barnabas or other short-term training programs



- Consider taking classes in The National Institute if you are attending Grace College in the future
- Be a student who is not only a worker—but someone who can oversee other students—a servant-leader
